## **Central Arbitration Committee – Deputy Chairs and Members**

The Central Arbitration Committee encourages fair and efficient arrangements in the workplace by resolving collective disputes in England, Scotland and Wales, either by voluntary agreement or, if necessary, through a legal decision. The Central Arbitration Committee adjudicates on the recognition and de-recognition of trade unions for collective bargaining in the workplace whilst seeking agreement between a union and the employer where possible.

## **Civil Procedure Rule Committee - One Barrister**

The Civil Procedure Rule Committee was set up under the Civil Procedure Act 1997 to make rules of court for the Civil Division of the Court of Appeal, the High Court and the County Court.

## **Coal Authority - Non-Executive Directors**

The Coal Authority manages the effects of the UK's coal mining legacy. It also owns, on behalf of the country, the majority of the coal in Britain, and licenses coal mining.

## **Competition and Markets Authority - Non-executive Directors, Panel Members and Inquiry Chairs**

The Competition and Markets Authority works to promote competition for the benefit of consumers.

## **The Independent Commission for Aid Impact - Commissioner**

The Independent Commission for Aid Impact is the independent body responsible for scrutiny of UK aid. ICAI focuses on maximising the impact of the UK aid budget for intended beneficiaries and getting the best value for money for the UK taxpayer.

## **Independent Reconfiguration Panel – Member (Clinicians) (x2)**

The Independent Reconfiguration Panel provides independent expert advice to the Secretary of State on disputed proposals for changes to services in the NHS in England. The panel also offers on-going support and guidance to the NHS and other organisations on achieving successful change.

## **NHS Pay Review Body – Members**

The NHS Pay Review Body advises the Government on pay issues for the majority of non-medical and non-dental NHS employed staff on Agenda for Change pay, terms and conditions.

## **Nuclear Decommissioning Authority - Members**

The Nuclear Decommissioning Authority works to ensure the safe and efficient clean-up of the UK's nuclear legacy.

## **NHS Improvement – Members**

NHS Improvement (NHSI) is responsible for overseeing Foundation trusts and NHS trusts, as well as independent providers that provide NHS-funded care.

## **Ofcom - Chair and Audit and Risk Committee Member**

Ofcom is the regulator and competition authority for the UK communications industries. It regulates the TV and radio sectors, fixed line telecoms, mobiles, postal services, plus the airwaves over which wireless devices operate.

### **Office of Rail and Road – Chair**

The Office of Rail and Road is the independent economic and safety regulator for Britain's railways, and monitor of performance and efficiency for England's Strategic Road Network. ORR regulates Network Rail including setting the targets it has to achieve and reports regularly on its performance; the HighSpeed1 link to the channel tunnel; health and safety standards and compliance across the whole rail industry; and oversees competition and consumer rights issues in respect of the railways. ORR also monitors Highways England to hold the company to account on its commitments to improve the performance and efficiency of England's Strategic Road Network.

### **Prison & Probation Ombudsman - Ombudsman**

The Prisons and Probation Ombudsman carries out independent investigations into deaths and complaints in custody.

### **Prison Service Pay Review Body - Chair**

The Prison Service Pay Review Body gives independent advice on pay for governors, operation managers, prison officers and support grades in the England and Wales Prison Service, and equivalent posts in Northern Ireland.

### **Science Museum - Trustees**

The Science Museum Group is devoted to the history and contemporary practice of science, medicine, technology, industry and media. With 5 million visitors each year and an unrivalled collection, it consists of: Science Museum, Museum of Science and Industry (Manchester), National Railway Museum (York), National Media Museum and National Railway Museum (Shildon) - the most significant group of museums of science and innovation worldwide.

### **Small Business Commissioner – Committee Members**

The Small Business Commissioner builds on a package of measures to tackle late payment and unfavourable payment practices in the private sector.

### **Social Mobility Commission – Commissioners**

The Social Mobility Commission monitors progress towards improving social mobility in the UK, and promotes social mobility in England.
