
Members – Nuclear Decommissioning Authority – Closes Monday 29th April

National Gallery – Trustee

The Office of Rail and Road is the independent safety and economic regulator for Britain's railways and monitor of Highways England.

Ofgem – Non-Executive Director

The Office of Gas and Electricity Markets (Ofgem) is a non-ministerial department and an independent National Regulatory Authority. Ofgem's main objective is to protect the interests of existing and future electricity and gas consumers.

Royal Armouries – Chair

As the National Museum of Arms and Armour, Royal Armouries is Britain's oldest public museum and traces its roots to the Tower of London. Royal Armouries is home to the national collections of arms and armour, including artillery, and to the National Firearms Centre.

S4C – Chair

S4C is the only Welsh language public service broadcaster. It commissions independent producers from across Wales to make the majority of its programmes. S4C broadcasts sport, drama, music, factual, entertainment and events programmes, across a range of platforms, including online.

Social Work England (SWE) will be the new, specialist regulator for all child, family and adult social workers in England. SWE's main objective will be to protect the public by setting the standards for social workers, ensuring they meet our standards, are fully qualified and remain fit to practise.
