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#### Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS)

##### [UK Anti-Doping - 2x Members](#)

UK Anti-Doping (UKAD) is the United Kingdom's independent National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) and was set up in 2009. UKAD is responsible for the implementation of the Government's National Anti-Doping Policy for sport.

UKAD is looking to recruit two new Board members to fill vacancies arising in early 2022 when two current members complete their second terms on the UKAD Board. The Board has identified the skill sets it requires to discharge its role in ensuring the organisation retains its status as a world leading NADO. Specifically, these are: knowledge of disability/para sport, ideally in the 'elite' environment; and a financially qualified person to chair the Audit and Risk Committee. These roles will further help UKAD continue to develop its anti-doping activities and champion wider sport integrity.

##### [Independent Advisory Panel on Deaths in Custody \(IAPDC\) - Panel Member](#)

The IAPDC member will lead on discrete pieces of work identified with the IAPDC Chair and Ministerial Board on Deaths in Custody as priority issues requiring expert advice and research; work with fellow panel members to identify effective means to reduce the rate of deaths in custody, and communicate their findings authoritatively to Ministers.

### **[Insolvency Rules Committee \(IRC\) - Barrister Member](#)**

The Insolvency Rules Committee (IRC) is looking for a Barrister Member with detailed knowledge of primary and secondary insolvency legislation. The expected work programme in the short term is likely to include rules for a new special administration regime covering the nuclear sector and possible changes to the Insolvency Rules following a statutory review.

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## **Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC)**

### **[Ebbsfleet Development Corporation \(EDC\) - 3x Non-Executive Board Members](#)**

The Ebbsfleet Development Corporation has been set up to deliver a new Garden City of up to 15,000 homes at Ebbsfleet in North Kent. We are aiming to appoint three new Members to the EDC Board: someone with a good understanding of the role of audit to chair the Audit and Risk Assurance Committee; a Civil Engineer to provide insight into the delivery of EDC's infrastructure; and someone with expertise in the wider field of placemaking to help make Ebbsfleet a great place to live.

Candidates for these roles should have one or more of the following: experience of sound financial risk and performance management; a background in Civil Engineering; or knowledge, experience and achievement in Placemaking; the Built Environment, Sustainability and Architecture and/or Design.

Ofqual is the independent regulator for qualifications and assessment in England, and tasked with regulating over 170 organisations that provide these qualifications. Board members will shape the strategic direction of the organisation; and provide relevant, insightful challenge and guidance to the Ofqual executive team.

### **[National Institute for Health and Care Excellence - 2x Non-Executive Directors](#)**

Non-Executive Directors (NEDs) will contribute to the development of the Institute's objectives ensuring that they are reflected in their strategic planning; contribute to the governance of the Institute and hold the senior management team accountable for their performance; and provide counsel to the executive leadership when required. NEDs will work cooperatively to maintain good working relationships with key stakeholders.

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## **Home Office (HO)**

### **[Independent Examiner of Complaints \(ICE\)](#)**

The Home Office is committed to setting up an Independent Complaints Examiner function in their response to the Windrush Lessons Learned Review to ensure they are more open to scrutiny, and to learn from customer and stakeholder feedback. ICE will independent of the businesses from which complaints originate and be accountable, via the Home Office Sponsorship Unit, to Permanent Secretaries for delivering on their agreements. The ICE will consider complaints relating to maladministration across all parts of the Home Office, and those suppliers who are contracted to provide services on behalf of the Home Office.

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## **Ministry of Defence (MoD)**

### **[Nuclear Research Advisory Council \(NRAC\) - Member](#)**

MoD are looking to appoint two new Members to the Nuclear Research Advisory Council (NRAC) with expertise in the areas of Nuclear Manufacturing or Explosives Manufacturing. Members' responsibilities will include identifying topics for review, what the key questions are and to what part of the Nuclear Warhead User Requirements Document (URD) they affect.

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## **Ministry of Defence (MoD)**

### **[Armed Forces Pay Review Body \(AFPRB\) - Chair](#)**

The AFPRB provides independent, evidence-based advice on Armed Forces' pay to the Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Defence on the pay and charges for members of the Naval, Military and Air Forces of the Crown. In making recommendations, it takes into account the need to recruit, retain and motivate suitable people in the context of Service life, Government policies for improving services, funding, the inflation target and the need for Armed Forces' pay to be broadly comparable with civilians.

By virtue of being the Chair of the AFPRB, the Chair will also be a member of the Senior Salaries Review Body (SSRB) which provides independent evidence-based advice to the Prime Minister and relevant Secretaries of State on the pay of senior civil servants, the judiciary, senior officers of the armed forces, all senior managers in the NHS, Police and Crime Commissioners and chief police officers.

### **[Submarine Delivery Agency \(SDA\) - 2x Non-Executive Directors](#)**

The Submarine Delivery Agency (SDA) was established in April 2018 to manage the procurement, in-service support and disposal of UK nuclear submarines, which are some of the most complex equipment in the world. As a Non-Executive Director you will join the board of the SDA in holding the SDA Chief Executive and their senior Management Team to account on resource and business decisions.

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## **Home Office (HO)**

### **[Independent Anti Slavery Commissioner](#)**

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 established the role to drive the response by governments and its partners to tackle modern slavery in the UK and overseas. You will work across the UK, and where needed, internationally, with law enforcement, the criminal justice system, the public and private sector, NGOs and civil society, and directly with victims, to help build an evidence base so we can better target our collective activity to stamp out this vile crime for good.

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## **Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS)**

### **[Competition and Markets Authority \(CMA\) - Chair](#)**

The Competition and Markets Authority is responsible for strengthening business competition and preventing and reducing anti-competitive activities. The new Chair will lead an effective Board, setting the strategy for the organisation to meet new challenges including supporting the UK economy to grow post-coronavirus pandemic and taking more, and more complex, cases previously heard by the European Commission.

**Deadline: 18th January 2022**

#### Service Justice Board / Service Justice Executive Group – Non-Executive Director

The Service Justice System is a collection of bodies with varying degrees of independence and is a mechanism for dealing with service offences and criminal conduct offences carried out by those subject to Service law. The Service Justice Board (SJB) provides strategic leadership, identifies risks to adapt to changes in the environment, drives performance, and performs an advisory function. The Service Justice Executive Group (SJEG) is the working-level forum. Its function is to respond to the SJB's direction, seek management information and ensure that the SJB's agreed agenda is taken forward. The two Non-Executive Directors will sit on both the SJB and SJEG.

#### UK Hydrographic Office - Non-Executive Chair

The UK Hydrographic Office (UKHO) is a world-leading centre for hydrography, specialising in marine geospatial data to support safe, secure and thriving oceans. The UKHO provides this information and expert advice to the UK government as part of their public task.
